Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Annual visitation for issuance of Yearly permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 08 seats (10 seats including EWS) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) (ii) Rog Nidan Avum Vikriti Vigyan-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

## Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Govt. Ayurvedic College, Balangir, Odisha, at Tulasinagar Balangir-767001, P.O. Balangir, Odisha (Inst. ID-AYU0210) inspection was conducted on 15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 08 seats (10 seats including EWS) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) (ii) Rog Nidan Avum Vikriti Vigyan-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024"and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

### 1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG( BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is  $\frac{Available}{Required} x 100\% = \frac{26}{30} x 100\% = 86.66\%$  (Excluding Excess)

- 3) As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the 122<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 14.05.2026 and Board discussed and decided to ask for clarification on the aforementioned shortcomings/defects during assessment and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 17.05.2025. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 19.05.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. 1233/GAC&H dated 19.05.2025.
- 4) In view of the clarification submitted by the college, assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-

The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been once again carefully re-examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was once again placed in the 125h Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 09.06.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) Course as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria as per the Board policy letter dated 09.01.2025 and 20.01.2025. Hence, Board decided to issue Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024, Regulation 15 (7) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 08 seats (10 seats including EWS) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) (ii) Rog Nidan Avum Vikriti Vigyan-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

### "DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024, Regulation 15 (7) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to Govt. Ayurvedic College, Balangir, Odisha, at Tulasinagar Balangir-767001, P.O. Balangir, Odisha (Inst. ID-AYU0210) with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 08 seats (10 seats including EWS) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhanta-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) (ii) Rog Nidan Avum Vikriti Vigyan-04 seats (05 seats including EWS) for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-
  - I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 08 seats (10 seats including EWS) in 02 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
  - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for graduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.

v) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.

vi) The shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 4 above, shall be fulfilled.

11) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
